The Seasons of Life

Do you ever find yourself asking the question, "Lord, where are You?" Psalm 139:7-10 reminds us that God is near, even when His presence is difficult to perceive, and even when you're completely unaware of Him.

David reflects, "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence?" (Psalm 139:7). In asking these questions, David communicates that no matter where we might go, the Lord is right there with us. What a comfort to realize we are never beyond the reach of a God who is full of loving-kindness, mercy, and comfort.

In fact, our heavenly Father is and has been with believers every single day. We walk in the presence of the living God, whose Spirit lives in us (John 14:16-17). No matter what season of life you are in—no matter how long, short, painful, or easy it might be—God wants you to know you are never alone. What is more, He wants you to remember that the darkness is not dark to Him (Psalm 139:12). He knows what is up ahead and will be with you as you face it.


Our faithful and omnipresent God is a friend who sticks closer than a brother (Proverbs 18:24). He will never leave or forsake you in any season of your life. Each year, we watch summer turn to fall, which then gives way to winter. And though the timing is less predictable, our lives similarly go through different seasons. Some months are brimming with joy while others are a struggle of hardship. But one thing that stays the same throughout is the faithfulness of God.

In his first letter to the Corinthians, Paul writes, "God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (1:9). The Lord always does what He says He will do. He keeps His promises to you and will be with you in all seasons (Hebrews 13:5). That means no matter how dark, depressing, or hopeless your circumstances seem, or how good, these three things are true:

- 1. God will be faithful to you because that is His very nature (Deuteronomy 32:4).
- 2. God knows all about your situation; you are never alone (Psalm 139:1-5).
- 3. God can meet all of your needs and equip you for every phase of life (Philippians 4:19).

Remember, you will change and seasons will change, but God is always the same. He won't ever fail you or forget you. He is with you on this day or any other. Great is His faithfulness!

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study

This is not the same approach that you remember from your confirmation studies, a set of rules about what we should and should not do, although it is that of course. Rev. And if so, how do we apply the commandments to our lives?

In this ten-session series, Pastor Albert Tate takes us through the Ten Commandments and shows us how we were first loved by God and what it looks like to love Him in return. God wrote a love letter through His commandments so that we could know His heart and learn to love others in the same way.

It is hard to imagine how anyone who joins us for this study would not be blessed by this time together with God's handwritten love letter to His people.


Sew'n Sews

This is a powerful story on the fact that thankfulness inspires generosity.

A blind boy sat on the steps of a building with a hat by his feet. He held up a sign which read, "I am blind, please help."



There were only a few coins in the hat—spare change

from folks as they hurried past. A man was walking by. He took a few coins from his pocket and dropped them into the hat. He then took the sign, turned it around, and wrote some words. Then he put the sign back in the boy's hand so that everyone who walked by would see the new words.

Soon, the hat began to fill up. A lot more people were giving money to the blind boy. That afternoon, the man who had changed the sign returned to see how things were. The boy recognized his footsteps and asked, "Were you the one who changed my sign this morning? What did you write?"



The man said, "I only wrote the truth. I said what you said but in a

different way. I wrote, 'Today is a beautiful day, but I cannot see it.'"

Both signs spoke the truth. But the first sign simply said the boy was blind, while the second sign conveyed to everyone walking by how grateful they should be to see.

We see from this story that when the people walking by were inspired, they wanted to be generous.

Moral of the Story: Be thankful for what you have. Be creative. Be innovative. Think differently and positively.

When life gives you a 100 reasons to cry, show life that you have 1,000 reasons to smile.

The most beautiful thing is to see a person smiling... And even more beautiful is, knowing that you are the reason behind it!!

Abiding Savior Lutheran Preschool is offering a nine-week Christcentered, developmental, fun-filled summer session beginning June 12 with two different options, including Preschool Camp and Kindergarten Readiness Camp. The focus of Preschool Camp is on fun and social development with weekly themes, music, science, outdoor discoveries, and art. Kindergarten Readiness Camp is offered for all children entering Kindergarten or Transitional Kindergarten in the fall. Kindergarten Readiness Camp is a bridge from our play-based program to the more academic setting of Kindergarten. We focus on small group work, worksheets, phonics, handwriting, and math, including the use of manipulatives. Each child will receive the Handwriting Without Tears - Get Set For School Workbook.

The camp will begin Monday, June 12, and end Friday, August 11. The camp will be available for a total of nine weeks. We will be closed on Tuesday, July 4, observing the Independence Day holiday. We will be closed from August 14-25 for planning and cleaning. Preschool will open for the 2023-2024 School Year on August 29. We will be offering a half-day camp from 8:30 AM - 11:30AM, a school day camp from 8:30 AM - 3 PM, or an all-day camp from 7:45 AM - 5:15 PM. Your selections can be for 2, 3, 4, or 5 days of the week and any number of the available weeks as long as we have availability. We have limited space in the Summer Camp program, so if you are interested in having your child participate in the camp experience, please get your registration form and fee in soon. We will only be accepting students enrolled at Abiding Savior for the 22-23 or 23-24 school years. If you have

With Easter Sunday and the school's Easter break, Sunday School classes did not meet each Sunday, but class times still were filled with Bible stories and activities.

Deviating a bit from Bible lessons the children learned about St. Patrick, who transformed Ireland into a predominately Christian country, baptizing over 100,000 people.

Turning to the children's guidebook, they saw how He cares for all His creatures. They were reminded of the grateful, precious rains that the Lord has showered upon us. Through the narrative the children could see how water provides life to the birds and animals, nourishes crops and livestock in order for us all to live and grow. As the Beatitudes express, if God cares for the flowers of the fields, and birds in the air, how much more does He care for us. The children named many professional sports teams named after birds and animals, in homage to God's creatures.

On Palm Sunday, the children read the greatest Bible story, the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. They also observed Good Friday—being taught about sin, identifying a sin they are guilty of, writing it down on paper, taping it to a cross, then painting over it with red paint. By this, the children were told His blood was shed to cover all our sins. Furthermore, an explanation of "Good Friday" was presented. Although it was an excruciating "bad" day for Jesus which led to His death, it was "good" for us as sinners because it resulted in the

forgiveness of all our sins. They also made Easter greeting cards for the church's shut-ins.

For a special event, they went outside to the playground and lunch area to hunt for Easter eggs, which they thoroughly enjoyed.

In the photo below, you will see them gathered together, presumably to compare their treasures. One child found the "goose that laid the golden egg." Actually, it was a gold-colored plastic egg, but he was disappointed because there was nothing inside, whereas the other eggs all had treats inside.



When the children were asked if anything else was found empty on Easter, some responded that it was the tomb where Jesus had been buried. The child with the gold-colored egg was given a special treat, and for a couple of children who found no egg, those who found more than one were encouraged to offer an egg to them.
