Trust in God's Promises

Faith isn't a passive belief. It's an active confidence that stirs within our soul—an unwavering trust in God's promises and a firm conviction about His trustworthiness. When we're surrounded by uncertainty, our faith guides us and illuminates the path.

Hebrews 11:1 says, "Now faith is the certainty of things hoped for, a proof of things not seen." Those words can be viewed as an encouraging invitation to dwell in trust, which steadies the heart and anchors the soul. They are also a reminder that our hope rests in a loving and sovereign God.

In times of trials and challenges, faith becomes our refuge, whispering, "Don't be afraid, for God is with you." It motivates us to step out in obedience, even if doing so seems impossible. And it empowers us to face adversity with courage, knowing that God is working all things together for our good.

The Lord calls us to walk by faith (2 Corinthians 5:7) and surrender our doubts and fears to Him. He wants us to believe His promises, even when circumstances seem bleak; trusting in Him lets us see beyond the visible to the eternal. Then we will find strength, peace, and the presence of our loving God guiding us every step of the way.

In Matthew 17:20, Jesus tells the disciples, "Truly I say to you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you."

All of us should be encouraged by these words. Do you hear the power in them? Remember, a tiny seed of faith can unleash extraordinary possibilities. What matters is not the size of our faith but the object of it—namely, the One who created heaven and earth and holds all things in His hands. I the presence of our omnipotent God, no obstacle is insurmountable and no challenge too great.

When towering adversity confronts us, there might be a temptation to doubt and fret. But at such times we can choose to trust in God's sovereignty. It helps to find scriptures like Jeremiah 32:17 and to lean into those truths. We can also ask the Lord to give us grace and make faith arise within us.

Keep in mind that God is always on our side, and that means we have no reason to fear (Psalms 118:6). So, in times of uncertainty, let your mustard-seed faith blossom into bold prayers and courageous action!

While Christmas brought us face-to-face with Jesus as fully human—a baby son born to Mary and laid in a manger—the Sundays in Epiphany (Greek: to reveal) leave little doubt that we are looking at Jesus who is fully divine-the Son of God. If Christmas celebrates the fact that the Father gave his only begotten Son to the world, then Epiphany is the unwrapping of this gift. Today we have been called to see Jesus as the Light of the World and as true God. The themes of light and revelation to the nations are dominant during the season of Epiphany.

The Festival of Epiphany is always on January 6th, even if that isn't a Sunday. It is the secondoldest festival of the Christian church (only Easter is an older observance).

On the first Sunday after the Epiphany, we always observe the Baptism of our Lord, and on the last Sunday of the season—before Ash Wednesday—we always read about Jesus' Transfiguration. These two occasions bracket the season of Epiphany because they most clearly reveal who Jesus is: the divine Son of God.

The 135th Tournament of Roses Parade will be held on January 1, 2024, in Pasadena, California, under the theme of "Celebrating a World of Music." The iconic annual parade, beginning at 8:00 a.m., will feature marching bands from throughout the United States, high-stepping equestrian units, and dozens of majestic floral floats.

Psalm 98 calls forth a universal song of victory proclaimed with voices, lyre, trumpets, and horns. This is the song of God's victory, which He has achieved through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The people of God sing a new song-a song of hope, joy, and praise.

The 2024 LHM float, "Make a Joyful Noise unto the Lord," marks the 73rd time LHM has participated in the parade and features three heralding trumpets proceeding from a hymn book. Hanging from the trumpets are banners featuring the great mantra of the Lutheran Reformation, which is God's plan of salvation: Grace Alone, Faith Alone, Christ Alone. Salvation is a gift (grace) from God given to all of those who believe (faith) that Christ's death and resurrection is for you (Ephesians 2:4-9).



The LHM float invites viewers to meet-or meet anew-the Source of hope and joy that cannot be taken away by anything that the world throws at you. Come, see, hear, and experience God's goodness.

Riders on this year's float include Jeff Craig-Meyer, LHM's president of United States Ministries; Monta "Boom" Ekwanit Denow, director of LHM-Thailand; Eden Keefe, the new president of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML); and pastors and laypeople from throughout Southern California.

As a self-funded project of the Lutheran Hour Ministries Float Committee and the Southern California District of the International Lutheran Laymen's League, the LHM float is the only Christian float in the annual parade. The float carries on a mission to provide a Gospel witness to viewers everywhere, from the 5.5-mile parade route in Pasadena to televisions and computers around the world. There are several television channels, streaming outlets, and social media platforms televising the 2024 parade. Check your local listings for the best viewing options.
