comfort in knowing that God is working all things together for our good (Romans 8:28).


The beginning of a new year is a great time to think about how we can renew our commitment to Christ. Here are a couple of ideas:



TIMES FLIES! Everyone is saying it these days. Did it not seem only days ago that the 2024 tax season ended? Well, at the risk of being the bearer of bad news, the 2025 tax season for preparing 2024 taxes is almost upon us. And again this year the Abiding Savior free income tax service—named VITA—will open its doors this month! You may conveniently register online at the Abiding Savior website.

While companies aren't required to mail tax documents to recipients until the end of the month it is a well-organized and responsible citizen that begins to collect all tax-related docs now. Past years' experience discloses that well-meaning clients show up without important documents, and in a few cases, their documents are still in unopened envelopes!

As a great reminder, Abiding Savior clients are afforded important benefits not available to the general public.

Although members who reside in Laguna Woods Village have their own resident-only VITA service you are warmly invited to use our service, which is conducted here at church in an inviting Christian atmosphere.

First appointments begin on January 28; clients can register at


